New strategy to protect Ashridge Estate and Tring Woodlands

We commissioned ecological consultants, Footprint Ecology to undertake ecological and visitor surveys for the Chilterns Beechwoods Special Area of Conservation (SAC). Their report revealed that more action is needed to help protect Ashridge Estate and Tring Woodlands, which are under increasing visitor pressure.

We are working with Natural England, Hertfordshire County Council, neighbouring authorities and the National Trust, who care for Ashridge Estate, to develop an interim mitigation strategy.

Until this mitigation strategy

is in place, additional checks will be applied to all planning applications that involve the development of new homes (and some other types of development) within or close to the affected areas.

Berkhamsted Leisure Centre

Over the last 12 months, we have been investigating the potential of replacing Berkhamsted Leisure Centre with a new, modern leisure facility on the existing site.

The proposed leisure centre could deliver a range of new and improved facilities including a teaching pool, a larger fitness suite and a spa with treatment zone.

In February we launched a six-week consultation to find out your views on the proposals for the new leisure centre. Thank you to everyone who took the time to complete our survey, or come along to one of the drop-in sessions.

The decision on whether to proceed with the replacement leisure centre is dependent upon a number of factors, including the results of the consultation, final costings and planning consent.

To mark Her Majesty The Queen's Platinum Jubilee we're coming together as a community with celebrations and events over the extended bank holiday weekend.

Thursday 2 June marks 70 years since the coronation of Queen Elizabeth II - an historic milestone no previous monarch has achieved.

We're hosting a number of events including the Platinum Party in the Park on Thursday 2 June, in Gadebridge Park with free entertainment and performances for all the family to enjoy. The event ends with the lighting of the Platinum Jubilee Beacon and a firework finale.

On Saturday 4 June, in Gadebridge Park, we will be showing the live broadcast of the Platinum concert from Buckingham Palace, bringing together some of the world's biggest stars.

On Sunday 5 June, communities are encouraged to come together

to host their own Big Jubilee Lunch. Hemel Hempstead BID is organising a special event in Hemel town centre which will include live acts on the Rainbow Stage, children's activities and games and a vintage double decker bus which will be offering hop on rides around the town.

Cllr Julie Banks, Portfolio Holder for Community and Regulatory Services said: "We are delighted to be able to mark this very special anniversary and to bring the community together to celebrate this unique occasion. We are proud that as a borough we can honour the Queen for her incredible 70-year reign and look forward to commemorating this wonderful achievement."

In February the Big Hoot made a very welcome visit to Hemel Hempstead. The trail of 12 brightly coloured owls proved to be a very popular attraction, with many of you following the trail around the town centre and Old Town. It was also a great boost for our local businesses, with many people stopping to pop into shops or for a refreshment break on the way around.

Our borough and its local businesses have been back on screen in series three of hit Netflix show After Life. The Old Town doubles up as the fictional town of Tambury, with businesses such as the House of Elliott, The Tea Tree and The Old Town Artichoke featuring in the series. Gadebridge Park was used for the filming of the fayre scene in the final episode.

Filming in our borough has become increasingly popular due to our proximity to London, its diverse locations, historic charm and the welcoming response visiting productions receive from local residents and businesses.

In March we were delighted to install a new 'hope is everything' bench in St Mary's Square in the Old Town, where part of the After Life series was filmed, in recognition of the famous bench featured in the series. You can read more about it on page seven.

Throughout the COVID-19 pandemic we have provided a range of support to our local businesses, including advice, training and the administration of government grants.

For the last two years, COVID-19 restrictions have prevented us from hosting our Dacorum's Den initiative.

I'm thrilled that we have been able to relaunch the initiative this year, providing our fledgling entrepreneurs with the opportunity to pitch for grant funding of up to £1,000 to help their businesses grow. Find out more on page seven.

Over 1,000 of you followed the exciting trail on the Loyal Free app with hundreds more collecting trail maps from local businesses or downloading one from the Enjoy Dacorum or Hemel BID websites.

The trail was hugely popular with both families and walkers – encouraging many people to visit the town centre and Old Town high streets.

To mark the final series of the much-loved series After Life, Netflix has donated a bench to Hemel Hempstead.

The series is renowned for its scenes showing Ricky Gervais's leading character, Tony, on a bench at his local churchyard, as he continues to grieve for his wife Lisa, played by Kerry Godliman.

Hemel Hempstead was used for many locations in the village of Tambury and we have chosen to install the bench across the road from the location used as the newspaper office – used in real life by voluntary group Community Action Dacorum in the heart of Hemel's Old Town High Street. Many local businesses in the High Street were used in the programme including the House of Elliott and The Artichoke.

The benches have been commissioned alongside suicide prevention charity Campaign Against Living Miserably (CALM) - who offer help, advice and information to anyone who is struggling or in crisis. Those who visit a bench will be able to access resources from CALM via a unique QR code with the wording "Life can be tough, but there's always hope. Campaign Against Living

Keeping our borough clean

We've taken action to target anti-social behaviour such as littering by partnering with District Enforcement, a company that specialises in enviro-crime enforcement.

Since 1 November 2021, the company has been delegated the powers to issue Fixed Penalty Notices (FPNs) of £80 should it witness people littering, failing to clean up after their dog or breaching other Public Spaces Protection Orders.

This is in line with our commitment to a firmer approach to making our borough a cleaner and safer place to live, work and visit.

More than 1,743 fines have been issued since enforcement began with improvements being seen in high foot-fall areas.

Most of our residents take a real pride in their area and they hate to see the irresponsible few spoiling things for most people by littering, fly-tipping and generally spoiling the environment. We have cracked down on offenders and will continue to take enforcement action against those caught littering and fly-tipping.

We really appreciate the many formal and informal groups

and individuals who litter pick regularly in their local area. We're committed to helping all residents who volunteer by providing necessary information and support.

It was great news that five of our parks achieved green flag status yet again.

We have retained Green Flag Awards at Bunkers Park. Hemel Hempstead, Canal Fields. Berkhamsted, Chipperfield Common, Tring Memorial Garden and the Water Gardens, Hemel Hempstead

The green flags flying across Dacorum are a tribute to the efforts of both the staff and volunteers, who work tirelessly to make these spaces somewhere residents and visitors can relax in, enjoy and be proud of.

Back in November, more than 170 residents from 87 households participated in the sixth annual Dacorum Love Food, Hate Waste challenge.

Annually, UK households waste 4.5 million tonnes of edible food, which amounts to around £700 for an average family per year - the equivalent of almost £60 a month!

So there's really no downside when it comes to reducing food waste. It saves families money. reduces the amount of food that ends up in our bins to be disposed of and helps to slow down global warming and deforestation.

It's important we all acknowledge that the small actions we each take at home add up to make a huge collective difference. When you waste food, you are wasting the resources that went into growing or producing it.



Litter-picking teams are champions

The Street Champions litter picking team continues to grow, with more than 580 registered volunteers from across the borough. The volunteers regularly help to tidy their local areas, at a time and place to suit them. Between August 2021 and February 2022, the team collected more than 320 bags of litter. Every quarter the champions also have the opportunity to enter into a prize draw to win prizes or vouchers.

Between March and April many community groups, Scouts and Brownies, faith groups, schools, families and individuals from across the borough participated in Keep Britain Tidy's Great British Spring Clean 2022.

Nappy Natter

Choosing reusable nappies can reduce your family's carbon footprint by up to 40 per cent and reduce the amount of



waste sent to landfill. In February, we co-hosted a 'Nappy Natter' with the Stork and the Bees nappy library to give Dacorum residents an opportunity to find out about reusable nappies. We also discussed the HERTS Reusable Nappy Scheme which offers Hertfordshire residents a 15 per cent discount on selected reusable nappy products and accessories. Planting trees for the Jubilee

As part of the Jubilee celebrations, there is a UK-wide tree-planting initiative inviting people to take part to increase the amount of trees across the country.

As part of the Queen's Green Canopy, a tree will be planted off Queen's Square, Adeyfield, Hemel Hempstead between 11.30am – 12.30pm on Thursday 2 June. The site has been chosen in recognition of the Queen's visit in 1952.

The community and local dignitaries are invited to attend.

Throughout January and February, we've planted more than 1,300 trees as part of our tree-planting strategy and between now and 2025 another 1,000 native whips will be planted in Gadebridge Park combined with 30 more standard trees, and 2,000 whips in Bunkers Park.

Royal beacons to light up Jubilee

On Thursday 2 June, over 1,500 beacons will be lit throughout the United Kingdom, Channel Islands, Isle of Man and UK Overseas Territories.

For the first time, beacons will also be lit in each of the capital cities of the Commonwealth countries to mark the historic Jubilee.

As part of our live Jubilee celebrations in Gadebridge Park, we will be lighting a beacon at 9.45pm with our towns and parishes organising individual beacon lighting events.

Focus on council finances

As household budgets are squeezed so too is the council's budget which is used to support the most vulnerable in our community and provide essential services to all residents.

At the end of last year we were the only council in Hertfordshire to have published the 2021 financial statements in line with statutory government timelines. This was a great achievement and I want to thank the Council officers involved in this work which assures our stakeholders we are a well-managed organisation.

As the money we receive from central government continues to reduce, we in turn had to

raise Council Tax by 2.37 per cent this year. This works out at £5 increase a year for a Band D property as we only keep 11 per cent of the Council Tax you pay - with 78 per cent going to Hertfordshire County Council and 11 per cent to the Police and Crime Commissioner.

We have been processing the £150 Energy Bills Rebate. Most households in band A-D properties will have received the payment or information about how to claim it by the middle of May. Further details are available on our website. We have also been supporting businesses, paying around £1m of Omicron grants, and providing around £5m of business rates relief to local retail, hospitality and leisure businesses.

As we look to increase our commercial activities to support the local community it's good to report that income from our commercial properties has remained strong. Income levels have exceeded expectations by around 15 per cent, and occupancy remains above 95 per cent. This is a good indicator of how the local small independent businesses have progressed over the course of the pandemic.

Our transformation programme continues to ensure we can deliver services fit for the future. We have welcomed staff back to the office as COVID-19 restrictions eased while continuing to offer flexible working where we can. Our Council meetings have returned to the Forum but residents are now able to watch meetings online due to new technology adopted during the pandemic.

Climate and ecological emergency



How we are getting to net-zero

As a Council, we're responsible for less than one per cent of direct carbon emissions within the borough. We understand that our wider role in helping to address the climate and ecological emergency will be supporting others in reducing and offsetting the remaining 99 per cent of emissions.

We have published a climate and ecological emergency strategy to outline the steps that we're taking to reduce the council's and the wider borough's carbon emissions.

This document outlines several key objectives and how we will work to achieve these:

- 1. Reach net-zero emissions as an organisation by 2030
- 2. Reach net-zero emissions for our council housing stock, by 2050 at the latest
- 3. Support the borough in reducing its emissions and reaching net-zero as quickly as possible, by 2050 at the latest
- 4. Support the borough in improving biodiversity
- 5. Support the borough in creating more sustainable communities

The strategy provides an overview of our proposed actions under the key themes of transport, energy use, biodiversity and sustainable communities.

In autumn 2021, we set up the Dacorum Climate Action Network (Dacorum CAN) to help bring together local individuals and organisations to think global and act local. I'm pleased that

around 200 individuals and 40 organisations have already joined and many attended our first annual event in November, to coincide with COP26 - the global climate change conference. There were a diverse range of speakers and stall holders and attendees were able to make pledges on how they can cut their carbon emissions. Make a positive change and sign up here

As part of the Dacorum CAN work, we also support local environmental action through our Green Community Grants. This spring, we awarded £20,000 to nine groups. There was a brilliant range of projects including rewilding and monitoring of wildlife at various sites, tree planting at multiple locations. the creation and management of several ponds and a community 'make and mend' project incorporating clothes swaps.



HEAT - helping you save energy at home

Download the Hertfordshire Energy Advice Tool (HEAT) app on your smartphone to get some quick hints and tips on how to save money on your energy bills.

So far, 73 per cent of residents who downloaded the app found out they can save energy by washing their clothes at

30 degrees and 59 per cent could save £30 a year on their electricity bills by switching all their lights to LED bulbs.

These meadows are incredibly valuable wildlife habitats and can contain up to 40 different species per square metre.






£10,000 worth of free home improvements

Providing quality new council homes for our borough

Over the past few months we gained planning approval on several new developments and over the summer we will be on site building 173 new council homes. We are due to start on site or have just begun building at:

Mountbatten View - 58 one and two-bedroom apartments at Paradise Fields off St. Albans Road, Hemel Hempstead, The apartments have generous private balconies and under floor heating which will be provided by communal air source heat pumps. There will

also be a central garden, secure cycle stores and electric vehicle charging.

- Eastwick Row a new apartment block in Adevfield which will provide 34 new homes with improvements to parking and landscaping.
- Randalls Ride 30 new homes made up of 18 one-bedroom apartments and 12 twobedroom apartments with Juliet balconies, parking and cycle storage in Highfield.

As part of our ongoing commitment to deliver muchneeded affordable housing. we're also working on plans to redevelop the Paradise Depot site, off St Albans Road in Hemel Hempstead. The current site which was the location of the food bank, depot and offices - run by local homeless charity DENS - will be redeveloped to accommodate 56 apartments, with a mix of oneand two-bedroom homes, and a new centre for DENS.

We have decided to fund the development of a new building for DENS as part of this development so that we can continue working in partnership with them on the delivery of essential community services.

We have also partnered with the Hills Group to provide modular homes in Aragon Close, Hemel Hempstead. SoloHaus are specially designed, furnished and fully equipped for a single person to move straight into. We're delighted to be able to provide these energy efficient homes for people in the greatest housing need in Dacorum. The modular homes provide an independent. safe environment for residents to take the next step into more permanent accommodation.

I hope that all our new tenants will be proud to call these new developments home and maybe some will go on to receive the success of Magenta Court in Apsley, which was announced as the winner of the Best Small Social Housing Development Award at the National Housebuilding Excellence Awards in February.





New homes completed in Kings Langley

Our village development of 10 two and three bedroom houses, including a fully compliant wheelchair accessible house, all for social rent in Coniston Road will soon welcome its first tenants. Built by our contractor, Bugler Developments Ltd, these energyefficient homes are highlyinsulated (above current building regulation requirements), have photovoltaic roof panels and

an external power supply for connection to electric vehicle wall chargers.

These homes will be let to applicants on our housing register.

Making our homes more energy efficient

We are carrying out work to fit energy-saving measures to our homes across the borough as part of our commitment to ensuring our housing stock is net zero by 2050 in line with UK targets.

We have been awarded £300.000 of Government funding to carry out energy efficiency upgrades to 24 council homes in Northend, Hemel Hempstead. The grant will be used to fit external wall insulation, double glazing and loft insulation to four blocks of flats this summer.



This will significantly increase the insulation performance on these homes and in turn help our tenants tackle rising fuel bills. The grant covers approximately 40 per cent of the project costs and we will covering the remaining 60 per cent.



St Margaret's Way

We have received planning permission for 46 new homes in St Margaret's Way in Leverstock Green. The development will provide 13 three-bedroom houses and three two-bedroom houses as well as 16 one-bedroom and 14 two-bedroom apartments all for social rent. Two of the flats will be wheelchair adapted.

These new homes will be energy-efficient with air source heat pumps and solar roof panels. Apartments will have private balconies or patio space on the ground floor. The development will also provide parking and retain a central green space.

We are planning to start on site in 2023.

Become a Block Champion


If you live in a council-owned block of flats, maisonettes or sheltered scheme you can become a 'Block Champion'.


Tenancy Reviews

Our Tenancy Management Officers will now aim to visit every tenant at least once every three years. This allows us to make sure all the information we have about your household is up to date. assess the condition of your home and give you the chance to ask questions about your home, your tenancy or your neighbourhood. We will ask you for two forms of identification as proof you are the legal tenant(s).



Knowing who lives at your home can help us in case of emergency. It also helps us protect against things like tenancy fraud and to identify and help with any support needs or safeguarding issues.

Making best use of council homes

The Housing Allocations Policy sets out how we prioritise applications for council and housing association homes based on applicants' circumstances and level of housing need.

We review this policy regularly to make sure that we are acting fairly and keeping all our homes occupied, so that we receive the rental income that allows us to deliver all our housing services.

This summer, we're changing our local connection requirements for village homes, reducing the length of time that applicants must have lived or worked in our rural areas and changing the ages children can share bedrooms.

We're also planning some changes that will allow some homeowners to apply for supported housing to meet their needs. The new policy will be published on our website soon.




Listening to you -2022 STAR survey

Peace of mind with Lifeline

Lifeline is an emergency community alarm service that allows you to have peace of mind and an added level of security in your own home. If you fall or have an emergency, you can contact the control centre quickly and easily by pressing the button on the main unit or pendant. Apply on our website, email lifeline@dacorum.gov.uk or call on 01442 228347 and we will send you an application pack.



If you currently use our Lifeline service:

We're supporting our Lifeline users to prepare for the UK changes to switch over the technology we use to make calls on landlines from 'analogue' to digital.

The changeover will happen by December 2025, when the old technology will stop working but phone providers have already started work on switching over the network.

When your phone provider contacts you to let you know the changover is taking place, please let them know you have a personal Lifeline unit in your property that uses your landline. You should also ask them for a free of charge battery backup unit, which keeps your Lifeline personal alarm working if there is a short power cut.

Online training portal launched for tenants

We've launched an online training portal to provide free training and wellbeing courses for tenants and housing applicants.

Dacorum Online Training (DOT) aims to improve the wellbeing of residents while helping tenants with advice and information on their tenancy.

The water we all use at home comes from our local environment and unfortunately. too much water is wasted.

Two causes of this are hidden leaky pipes and inefficient fittings, which many residents don't realise are often wasting huge amounts of water, effectively flushing their hardearned cash down the drain.

If you arrange a visit, Affinity Water's qualified technicians will come round to your house to identify and repair small leaks (where possible), offer to fit free water saving devices, and give you some advice about easy changes you could make to reduce your water bills.

A home visit should only take around 40 minutes and Affinity Water will cover 100 per cent of the cost of your visit (normally worth £80), and there are no hidden charges.
